Local Government General Obligation Bonds

General obligation (GO) bonds have historically provided local agencies with the lowest borrowing costs among the types of long-term bonds they may issue. In California, GO bonds are backed by a pledge of the issuer to levy ad valorem property taxes as necessary to pay debt service.

GO Bond Approved
\$26,100,100
Vote in Favor: 78.6%

Purpose

Repair and rebuild aging classrooms and facilities throughout the District; meet handicapped access requirements, increase student access to computers and modern technology; and upgrade outdated heating and air conditioning systems

Measure HH

November 2016
GO Bond Approved
\$30,000,000
Vote in Favor: 83.2%

Purpose

Repair and rebuild aging classrooms and facilities throughout the District; meet handicapped access requirements; increase student access to computers /technology; repair roofs; and improve campus security and student loading zones for increased safety.



A request for qualifications has been issued for architectural services. Proposals will be evaluated and negotiations on a contract will commence.


Projects that do not need architectural services will be proposed for board action.

Mailer informing the community of the bond programs and other activities occurring in the district will be mailed out.


